



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### How to play Hopscotch

•Draw a hopscotch design on the ground with chalk.

•Throw a flat stone or similar object (small beanbag, shell, button, plastic toy) to land on square one.

•Hop through the squares, skipping the one your marker on.

•Pick up the marker on your way back.

•Pass the marker on to the next person.

### Addition War

Materials: Deck of playing cards 2 players

1. Deal the deck between the two people until all the cards are dealt.

2. Each person turns over 2 cards.

- 3. Each person adds his or her numbers together.
- 4. Whoever has the highest total keeps all four cards.

5. If totals are the same, each person places three cards face down and turns one card over.
6. The player with the highest card keeps all of the cards in that round.

7. Continue to play until one player has all of the cards.
